Discounted Fares

UTA offers discounted fares. Monthly passes have been purchased by the stake at 25% of the costs normally required. These passes are available to members deemed in need of short-term transportation for the purposes of getting to work or finding work. If you feel your circumstance qualifies for a monthly pass provided by the stake, contact your Elder's Quorum president, Relief Society President, or Bishop to review your situation.

Medicaid

Medicaid recipients may be eligible for non-emergency medical transportation including bus passes, personal transportation reimbursement, Flex Trans, and ModivvCare Medical Transport for door-to-door services. Transportation to non-Medicaid providers or to receive non-Medicaid covered services, is not covered.

On Demand Service in Certain Zones

In 2022, Utah Transit introduced an app-based service that will pick people up close to home and drop them off close to their destination by combining a few riders into a single van. The trip must begin and end within a designated zone. Currently these zones are:

1. South Valley (Herriman, Daybreak, South Jordan, Riverton, Bluffdale and Draper)
2. Salt Lake City Westside (Rose Park, Fairpark, Poplar Grove and Glendale)
3. Tooele County (Grantsville, Stansbury Park, Erda and Tooele City)
4. South Davis County (Centerville South to the County Line)
5. West Provo/Orem (north from Lakeview Parkway, on the west of Provo, to the south side of University Parkway directly across from Utah Valley University, with service to 3 points outside the zone proper, Utah Valley Hospital, Orem Central Station and the Provo Rec Center).

People who can't use the app can also call to schedule rides.
